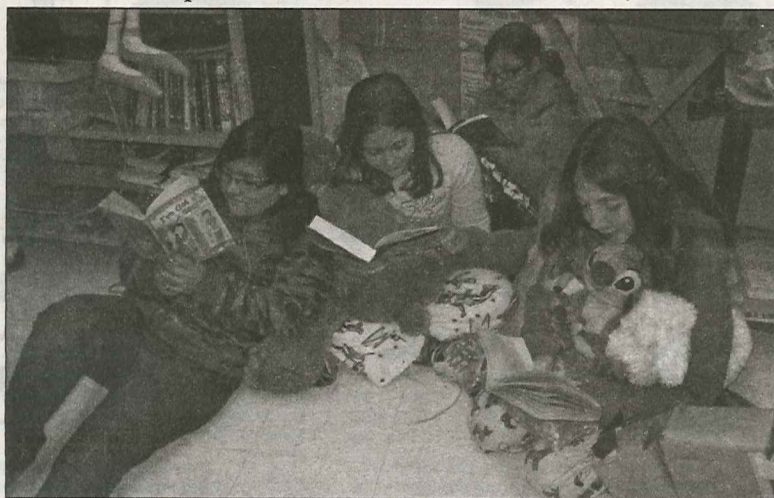


# Stone School holds its own "Idita-Read"

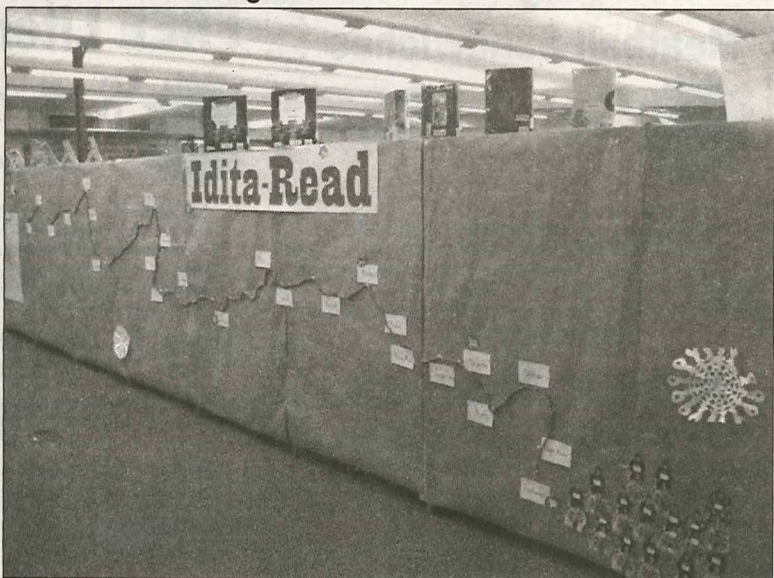
At the end of the Idita-read, the school will host a celebratory assembly where Carol Preble, who is part of the Sibe-

Students' reading minutes/points will be tracked with a class sled/dog team on a big board in the school library

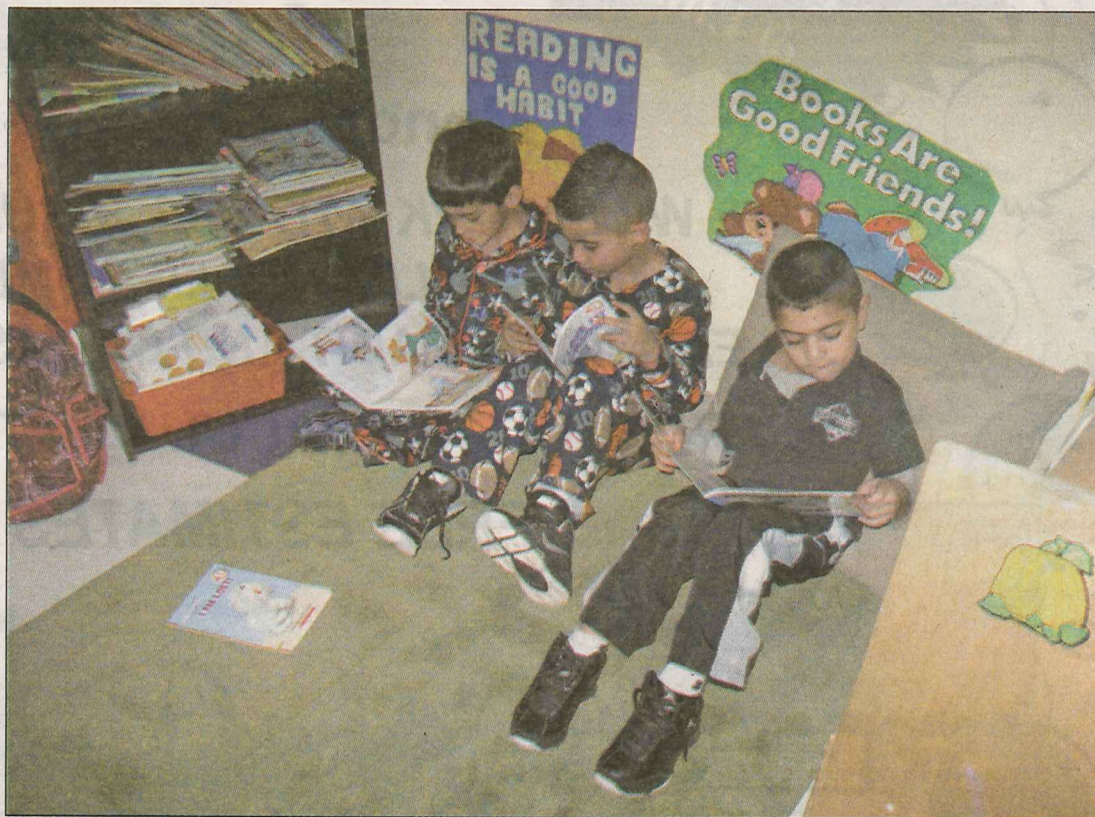
