

# Dist. 4 announces changes to transportation service

ADDISON — District 4 has made changes to the transportation services being offered to students in the fall due to state budget cuts and the need to trim expenses from the budget. The number of students who will be riding busses during the 2011-12 school will be greatly reduced and, therefore, the number of students who may be walking to school beginning this fall may be greatly increased. In order to provide for the safety of the 'walkers', school district, Village of Addison, and Addison police officials have been working on plans to increase the number of crossing guards that will be located at hazardous crossings throughout Addison.

The Village of Addison and Addison School District 4 have asked Andy Frain Services to assist in accepting applications for permanent part-time and substitute crossing guards for the new school year. Guards will earn up to \$100 per week, working 1 to 2 hours each school day. Applicants must be willing to have criminal background and pre-employment screening performed as required.
