## Comcast plans upgrades:

Comcast will perform system upgrades in Bloomington for two weeks starting at midnight Monday, Sept. 28, officials said. To minimize cable, broadband and telephone interruptions, the FCC requires Comcast to work primarily between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. Monday through Saturday. Upgrades will be made in utility easements, many of which are in backyards. Workers will have identification. They will use flashlights while working for about two hours at each site. Comcast cable, Internet and telephone service may be down in some areas during the work. Comcast will call customers, and distribute door hangers 24 to 48 hours in advance of starting work in each area. For details, call (866) 594-1234.

## Golf course opens today

Bowes Creek Country Club, the region's newest golf course, opens today. The Elgin city-owned course will be open Saturday and Sunday through the end of the golf season, according to head pro Mike Lehman. The course is par 72 and can play up to 6,900 yards. Mature woods complement the wide fairways. It has water on several holes, and is defined, in part, by its fescue-rimmed bunkers. Rates range from \$35 to \$89 and include unlimited golf, carts with global positioning systems and use of the practice facility. After 1 p.m. kids younger than 16 play free with a paid adult. Bowes Creek is at 1250 Bowes Creek Blvd., about two miles west of Randall Road.
