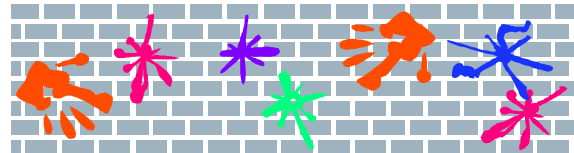


Talk with and listen to your child as you play and do daily activities together.

Read with your child everyday.

Take your child to the library and find out about the special services and activities available to you.

Check with the local park district to find activities for your child.

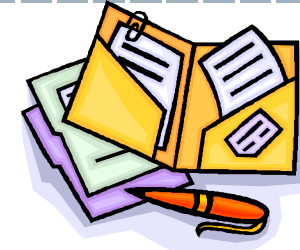
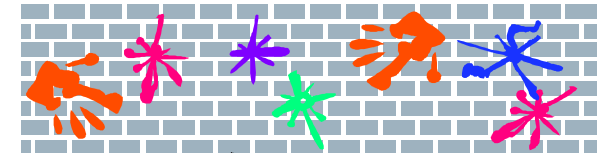
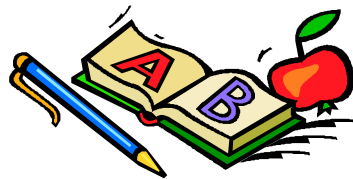


Create a special place in your home for your child to read and write.

Have writing materials available, (crayons, markers, chalk, pencils, stamps etc.)

Take books and writing materials for your child whenever you leave home.

Model reading for your child. (Examples- Let your child see you reading newspapers, magazines, cookbooks etc.) If they see that reading is important to you, it will become a priority for them.



Help your child identify and recognize colors, shapes, numbers 1-10, and the letters of the alphabet.

At school, we will use the name that appears on your child's birth certificate. Practice writing this name at home. Also, please teach your child to respond to his/her correct name.

Encourage your child to do things for themselves when they are ready, (zipping, tying shoes, buttoning, snapping) Also, let them feed, dress, and clean up after themselves.

Please have all your child's school supplies labeled and ready to go at the beginning of the school year.
